WILD BOAR FARMS EXOTIC TOMATOES

If you know tomatoes then you are familiar with Brad Gates' Wild Boar Farm; a small organic farmer, tomato breeder, and grower of heirlooms since 2000. He has developed his tomatoes from over 1,000 heirlooms, crosses, and heirloom marriages. His focus: extreme flavor and fascinating looks.

His varieties are marked with ^{BG}

EARLY SEASON

Bloody Butcher Rich heirloom flavor and deep, red color. Five to nine 2" fruits per cluster. Indeterminate 55 days

Purple Prince A Russian heirloom, produces medium sized black-purple fruit. Plum shaped fruit is seedy, but has excellent flavor. A prolific, early producer. Indeterminate 65 days

Pink Berkeley Tie Dye^{BG} A tasty blend of sweet and spice. Rosy-blushed, 8-12 ounce fruit have green skin with yellow streaks and fascinating green interior streaked with red and yellow. Early, relatively compact. Indeterminate 65 days

Sweet Canernos^{BG} Beautiful rose pink with gold colored stripes. 2-4 oz. round tomato with deliciously sweet, slightly tangy gourmet flavor. High yields and crack-resistant. Indeterminate 65 days

Lemon Boy Lemon yellow, not golden in color. Highly adaptable plants yield large, deep oblate fruits, averaging 6 - 7 oz. and about 3-1/2" across. Mild flavored and adds an inviting color to salads. Indeterminate 72 Days

Large Barred Boar^{BG} Flattened beefsteak tomatoes are pink/brown with metallic green stripes and weigh 8-12 oz. Very meaty pink flesh is very flavorful. Indeterminate 65-70 days

Goliath Sunny Big juicy fruits, mild and sweet, with a medium-soft texture and a mouth-watering juiciness when ripe. Large, 7 to 8 oz. fruits can be harvested when they first turn yellow, or left on the vine until they reach a brilliant shade of gold. Ideal for those who don't like the highly acidic bite of most red tomatoes, and bound to be appreciated by anyone who values eye appeal as much as quality. Indeterminate 70 Days

MAIN SEASON

Black from Tula Russian heirloom with good yields of brownish-red slightly flattened globes up to 14 oz. Rich full flavor, great for slicing and canning. Intermediate 75-80 days

Black Krim – aka Black Crimea Beefsteak fruits are a unique combination of violet-brown and purple-red, they turn almost black with sufficient sunlight and heat. Excellent full flavor. Indeterminate 70-80 day

Black Seaman Russian heirloom produces medium sized brownish-pink fruits with olive green shading. Small plants, rich flavor, potato leaf foliage. Determinate 75 days

Cherokee Purple Uniquely colored dusty rose-brown fruits weight up to 12 ounces. Delicious sweet flesh. Indeterminate 75-90 days

Japanese Trifele Black One of the best Russian black tomatoes. High yields of blemish-free, deep red 4-5 oz. fruits that rarely crack. Rich, full flavor. Potato leaf variety. Indeterminate 70-80 days

Pork Chop^{BG} A true yellow tomato, starts off yellow with green stripes which ripen to gold. Medium sized, slightly flattened beefsteaks with a great sweet tomato flavor with hints of citrus. Indeterminate 75-80 days

Solar Flare^{BG} A red beefsteak with gold stripes, very meaty with luscious sweet red tomato flavor. 6-10 oz. fruit, great production. Indeterminate 75 days

Dr Wyches Yellow The 1 lb fruit is solid and smooth; the color is a glowing tangerine-orange that always stands out in the kitchen or on the vine. One of the best heirloom orange types with its smooth texture and tropical, sweet taste, heavy yields. Indeterminate 75-80 days

Beauty King^{BG} Large stunning red yellow bi-color, yellow with flashy red stripes (not blotches). Interior is yellow with bright red streaks, very meaty. Very good sweet tomato flavor. 12-20 oz fruit with good to very good production. Heirloom marriage: Big Rainbow and Green Zebra. Indeterminate 75-80 days

Carbon This heirloom boasts the signature rich flavor and meaty texture of a classic black tomato. Resists cracking and cat-facing, a blocky round, 10-14 oz. fruit with dark olive shoulders fades into a very dark, brick red. Rich, complex flavors make this variety the winner of a recent heirloom tomato taste testing at Cornell University. Indeterminate. 76 days

Chef's Choice Orange Balanced, rich heirloom flavor (adapted from the heirloom 'Amana Orange', but much earlier) this bright orange 9-12 oz. fruits keep their radiant tangerine tones, fresh or cooked. Impressive production, disease resistant, resists cracking. Indeterminate 75 days AAS Award 2014

Thessaloniki Developed in Greece, plants produce uniform, smooth, 4-6 oz. red fruits with solid, meaty flesh. Resistant to sunburn, cracks and spot. Indeterminate 66-77 days

LATE SEASON

Aunt Ruby's German Green Large beefsteak fruits weigh 1 lb. or more. Sweet juicy flesh with a hint of spiciness. Ready to harvest when soft to the touch and yellow-green in color. Indeterminate 80-90 days

Paul Robeson Named in honor of the famous opera singer in 1937, Paul Robeson was an Equal Rights Advocate for Blacks in Russia as well as all around the world. This Russian heirloom has almost a cult following among tomato connoisseurs. Amazing flavor that is distinctive, sweet and smoky. 7-10 oz fruits are a black-brick color. Indeterminate 90 days

Janet's Jewel^{BG} Large bright orange (jacinthe) striped beefsteak. Very meaty. Very tasty. Sweet with some fruity notes. 1 lb. fruit, good to very good production. Indeterminate 90 days.

Pineapple Pig^{BG} 1 lb. fruit, large, meaty, creamy yellow striped bi-color with rose blush lower acid – sweet huge, late and worth the wait.

Costoluto Genovese An old Italian favorite since the early 19th century, the fluted heirloom fruits are rather flattened and quite attractive with their deep ribbing. This variety is a standard in Italy for both fresh eating and preserving, and known for its intensely flavorful, deep red flesh. Indeterminate 90 days

Chef's Choice Yellow Tomato lovers and culinary gardeners will rave about this large, meaty delicacy. Gorgeous 10 oz. beefsteak-type fruits have a sweet, citrus-like flavor with just the right amount of acid and the perfect tomato texture. Plants produce loads of 6"- 7" golden yellow fruits. Resistant to crack and scab. Indeterminate. 90 days AAS Award 2017

Chef's Choice Pink Very large, 12 - 14 oz. (often over 1 lb.), pink meaty fruits have the perfect acid to sugar ratio. Easier to grow than most beefsteaks - definitely give this one a try. Great for stewing or canning, as well as eating fresh. Potato leaved plants are scab and crack resistant. High yields. Indeterminate 95 Days AAS Award 2015

Crnkovic Yugoslavian [OG] Pink beefsteak fruits weight up to 1 lb., near perfect shoulders that rarely crack. Delicious full tomato flavor. Indeterminate 70-80 days

Dester Seed was obtained from an Amish woman who worked for a doctor who brought the heirloom seed from Germany. Luscious pink beefsteaks weighing up to 1 lb. Indeterminate 70-80 days

Persimmon Dating back to the mid-1800s, this heirloom is one of the best tasting yellow tomatoes. Healthy vines bear big beefsteak size fruit with few blemishes. Indeterminate 80 days

LATE SEASON

Brandywine One of the most popular heirlooms. Flavorful but not acidic, large-lobed beefsteaks with thin pinkish-red skins grow on unusually upright, potato-leaved plants. Fruits set one or two per cluster and ripen late – and are worth the wait. Brandywine's qualities really shine when it develops an incredible fine, sweet flavor. Indeterminate 85 days

Mamie Brown's Pink Pink beefsteaks of varying shapes, double fruits are somewhat common. Perfect sweet/acid flavor balance. Indeterminate 80 days

Super Beefsteak An improved beefsteak type with a bigger yield and meaty fruits more than 1 lb. in weight. Indeterminate 80 days

CHERRY TOMATOES

EARLY SEASON

Black Cherry Vigorous plants covered in clusters of 1" round dusky purple-black fruits with a rich, sweet, and complex flavor. Indeterminate 65 days

Sun Gold Flavorful, golden-orange cherry sized fruits are borne on large clusters. Excellent served whole in salads, on the relish tray or as a snack. Indeterminate 65 days

White Cherry Pale yellow to ivory 1 oz. fruits (paler with less sun exposure) makes an excellent color addition to your meals. Sweet, fruity flavor. Indeterminate 70 days

MAIN SEASON

Isis Candy Cherry Gorgeous bicolor cherry tomatoes are red with a spectacular cat's eye starburst on the blossom end. Rich, sweet, fruity flavor. Plants are loaded with 1 ½" fruits on clusters of 6-8. Indeterminate 70-80 days

Mint Julip^{BG} Unique plum/pear shaped, 1-1/2 oz. fruits have a pleasant tomato taste with a nice overall sweet flavor that is less tart than other green varieties. *Also known as Michael Pollan.* Extremely high yields with one plant often producing as much as 5 gallons of fruit! Indeterminate 75-80 days

BASIL

Fiesta Lime Rare lime scented variety is sweet and fragrant, with a mild citrus taste. Excellent for flavoring sauces, dressings and desserts. 16-24" high. 60-90 day

Italian Large Leaf Basil 'Bruchetta' This is THE authentic Neapolitan Basil for Italian cuisine, especially pesto. You can use it fresh or dried. This plant is a warrior in the garden, where it repels aphids, mites and tomato hornworms. 24"-30" H x 12" W

Italian Sweet Basil 'That's Italian' Aromatic and flavorful, sweet basil is used as a flavoring with tomatoes and mild flavored vegetables such as squash, excellent for flavoring veal and lamb too. A common basil used for pesto. 12"-18" H x 10"-12" W 60 days

EGGPLANT

Classic Glossy, 8" to 9" fruit; teardrop fruit shape; purple-black color. A classic variety. 76 days

Pinstripe Compact, high-yielding and spine-free plants bear eye-catching, mid-size, oval purple and white striped fruit over silver-green foliage. 60-65 days

PEPPERS

SWEET

Lady Bell Produces 3 to 4-lobed bells, 4" x 3.5" green turning to red. TMV resistant. 71 days

Purple Beauty This absolutely stunning purple bell pepper has a tender, crisp texture and low-key, sweet flavor. The large, four-lobed, thick-walled fruits remain purple for some time before ripening to a radiant purple-red and are borne on sturdy, compact plants. 70-75 days

Yummy Mix Popular Yummy Orange keeps good company in this mix that includes complimentary red and yellow fruits. All are nearly seedless, crisp and very sweet. Robust plants reach 18 to 24 inches in height, producing continuous sets of blocky, 2-1/2" fruits. A good choice for home gardens, with irresistible eye-appeal. Gardeners will love these "snack peppers" for everything from fresh eating to homemade salsa. 73 Days

HOT

Bangkok Small, fiery-hot fruits avg. 3" and set heavily on big, upright plants. Suitable for using green or red at the fresh stage or dried for making hot pepper flakes or mini ristras. 75 days/green, 95 days/red

Habanero Orange Among the very hottest peppers ever measured! Lantern-shaped pods have thin, wrinkled, light green flesh and ripen to a golden orange. 75 days/green, 100 days/orange

Jalapeño Produces 3-inch, thick-walled, moderately hot pods with deep green color that matures to a bright red. The skin may show a netting pattern as fruit ages, but it does not affect flavor. Often, the heat of the peppers will vary, even those from the same plant 72 days

GARDEN BEDDING PLANTS

Why buy a packet of seed when you only want one or two plants? Try something new with our mixed variety six packs. Selections of garden bedding plants will be offered to jump start your garden and provide you with a variety of vegetables. Care should be taken when planting these plants as transplants; handle the root ball as little as possible and avoid touching the stems with any kind of pinching motion.

Bedding plants are targeted for unusual varieties or those you won't find in the retail market, e.g., striped beets, unusual coloring, heirloom varieties, etc. The following list is planned for bedding plants and may be combined within a six pack:

Arugula, Beans, Beets, Corn, Cucumbers, Kale, Lettuces, Melons, Pumpkins, Spinach, Summer and Winter Squash, Swiss Chard.
